



Chapter Three: The Outward Deluge of Scrappy Churches

• John 4:27-38



Scrappy churches commit to an outward deluge through sustained, seasonal, and special focus.



Introduction... Discussion Questions

- Have you ever been in a church situation where it was necessary to "circle the wagons"?
- If so, explain.
- If not, what might cause leadership to adopt such a mentality?



When there are problems in the church, the tendency is to pour our attention and resources inward.

Rather than pouring our energies into community and growth, we lower our aim and shoot for simply keeping those who remain happy.



Introduction... Discussion Questions

- What is dangerous about directing church focus internally?
- Is Dr. Rainer's point in chapter 3 of Scrappy Church that we should never focus on or address internal issues? In your own words, what is his point?



In our efforts to stop the internal bleeding, we end up neglecting the external, letting those who are desperately injured continue to remain so.

In the process, we neglect the mandates of the <u>Great</u> <u>Commission</u> and <u>Great</u> <u>Commandment</u>, and we continue to struggle.

What was your initial response to the call to an "outward deluge" in chapter three of Scrappy Church?



John 4:27-38

²⁷ Just then his disciples came back. They marveled that he was talking with a woman, but no one said, "What do you seek?" or, "Why are you talking with her?" ²⁸ So the woman left her water jar and went away into town and said to the people, ²⁹ "Come, see a man who told me all that I ever did. Can this be the Christ?" ³⁰ They went out of the town and were coming to him.

³¹ Meanwhile the disciples were urging him, saying, "Rabbi, eat."

John 4:27-38 (continued)

³² But he said to them, "I have food to eat that you do not know about." 33 So the disciples said to one another, "Has anyone brought him something to eat?" ³⁴ Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to accomplish his work. 35 Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest'? Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest. ³⁶ Already the one who reaps is receiving wages and gathering fruit for eternal life, so that sower and reaper may rejoice together. ³⁷ For here the saying holds true, 'One sows and another reaps.' 38 I sent you to reap that for which you did not labor. Others have labored, and you have entered into their labor."


