
Introduction – Letting Your Light Shine!

The Healing of the Leper

Today's world is often caught up with issues of identity. From politics, to gender, to favorite sporting teams, people seek to know themselves and others around them and determine what defines them both in relation to their community and at the core of their being.

Opening Discussion: Isolated

Think about a time when you felt like an "outsider" to a group. What pains or challenges were part of that experience?

What can be the prolonged effects of living in isolation especially during times of stress or physical illness?



Leviticus 13:45-46 with Discussion

⁴⁵ "The leprous person who has the disease shall wear torn clothes and let the hair of his head hang loose, and he shall cover his upper lip^[a] and cry out, 'Unclean, unclean.' ⁴⁶ He shall remain unclean as long as he has the disease. He is unclean. He shall live alone. His dwelling shall be outside the camp.




